Levels of Formal Education

Elementary

Middle School

Secondary

Post-Secondary

Elementary School usually runs from kindergarten or grade 1 through either grade 5 or 6, depending on the region. In some regions elementary school includes up to grade 9.

Depending on location, **Middle School** contains grades 7-9, and is also sometimes called an intermediate school, junior high school or just junior high.

Also called high school, **Secondary School** includes grades 10, 11, and 12

Any education beyond high school. Examples of **Post-Secondary** include: a college diploma (1 year) or certificate (2 years), any apprenticeship program completion or journeyperson certification university or college diplomas, certificates, or degrees, and/or any other training or education that is recognized by an educational authority.

Secondary Education (Grades 10-12)

The provincial Ministry of Education controls many aspects of secondary education in Saskatchewan. The aspects that have the most effect on you are:

- 1. Curriculum
- 2. Credit Requirements in Saskatchewan
- 3. Transcripts



1/ Curriculum

Curriculum outlines what knowledge and/or skills should be learned by taking a particular class or program



2/ Credit Requirements in Saskatchewan

Students must have a minimum of 24 credits to receive their grade 12 diploma. A minimum of 5 of these credits must be at the 30 level.

At each level there are 3 types of credits:

- Compulsory (required) Credits Students must have these credits to graduate.
- Required Elective Credits Students must have a credit or credits in certain subject areas where they have some choice of classes to choose from.
- <u>Elective Credits</u> –Students can take courses from this area to fulfill their 24-credit minimum. These are often areas of interest.

Types of Credits



All courses are divided into 3 grade levels:

- Grade 10 level credits are identified with a course number that starts with a 1.
 Example: Science 10
- Grade 11 level subjects are identified with a course number that starts with a 2.
 Example: History 20
- Grade 12 level subjects are identified with a course number that starts with a 3.
 Example: Drama 30

Types of Credits



Grade 10 Required Credits

- English Language Arts A10 (ELA A10)
- English Language Arts B10 (ELA B10)
- Science 10
- One of: Social Studies 10, or History 10, or Native Studies 10
- One grade 10 level Math

Compulsory Required Credits



Grade 11 Required Credits

English Language Arts 20 (ELA 20)

Compulsory Required Credits



Grade 12 Required Credits

- English Language Arts A30 (ELA A30)
- English Language Arts B30 (ELA B30)
- One of: Canadian Studies History 30, or Canadian Studies 30 or Native Studies 30

Compulsory Required Credits

Minimum of One (1):

- Math credit at the 20 or 30 level
- Science credit at the 20 or 30 level
- Social Science credit at the 20 or 30 level: (History 20, Psychology 20, Psychology 30, Law 30)
- Wellness 10 <u>OR</u> Physical Education 20 <u>OR</u> Physical Education 30






10-12 Mathematics Pathways Framework
